<u>REVIEW:</u> Ten Times Table by Alan Ayckbourn

October 24-26 saw us back at Brentwood School to perform this chaotic comedy, under the capable direction of Graham Poulteney. Set in the 1970s, a group of villagers hold a series of meetings to arrange a pageant, commemorating a 300 year old skirmish between the landowners and the workers, which ends up being al-



most as violent as the original uprising! A fabulous group of actors, all Marlborough veterans, brought the show to life to great response from the audiences. Thank you to everyone who came along to see us. Our review from NODA (National Operatic and Dramatic Association), of which we are members, stated the club provided "a charmingly unpredictable evening filled with memorable performances" and "one of the highlights of the production was the ensemble's

cohesive and believable acting." Graham made great use of all of the Memorial Hall's many doors with some of the action happening amongst the audience, and the minimal set conveyed to the audience that they were witnessing ordinary committee meetings that just hap-

pened to be occurring in front of them. With much required of the sound and lighting crew, with lights flickering and hammering offstage, it really was a production that included the experienced backstage crew as key parts of the action. > acting, directing and on the committee as well as latterly a Vice President. The shed was built at the end of October and officially opened by the committee with members of




